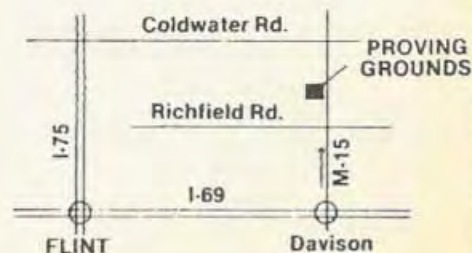
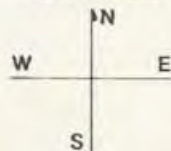

# Great Lakes Four Wheel Drive Association Quarterly Meeting — MINUTES —

April 12, 1981  
Otsego, MI

The meeting was called to order at 11:32 a.m. by the President Thom Bachman.

Roll Call 30 clubs were present. A quorum was present.

Secretary's Report - Thom Bachman read the Secretary's Report, since it was not printed in the Boondocker. Dick Hubler made a motion to accept the Secretary's Report as read. Cindi Healey seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report - Claude Conn made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as read. Evelyn Lakosky seconded. Motion carried.

Membership Secretary's Report - Tri-City Swamp Rats. They enjoy trail riding and mud running. They have 19 members. Dick Hubler made a motion to accept them into Great Lakes. Brad Perkins seconded. Motion carried. Welcome Tri-City Swamp Rats.

Northern Michigan 4-Wheelers - They have 16 members. Some of their members enjoy competition. Bob Lakosky made a motion to accept them into Great Lakes. Cindi Healey seconded. Motion carried. Welcome Northern Michigan 4-Wheelers.

Blue Water 4X4's - They have 20 members. They enjoy trail riding and competition. Brad Perkins made a motion to accept them into Great Lakes. Bob Lakosky seconded. Motion carried. Welcome Blue Water 4X4's.

Foolish Pleasure 4-Wheelers - They have 21 members. Roger Roney made a motion to accept them into Great Lakes. Putt Caverly seconded. Motion carried. Welcome Foolish Pleasure 4-Wheelers.

Land Management - Harry Wolfe gave us a report on Land Management.

Our biggest concern right now is the closing of the Brighton Land, and the Saugatuck Dunes State Park.

The reason for the Brighton Property closings was due to the lack of funds. M.U.C.C. is also working on the Brighton problem.

Jim Wicks was present at this meeting to answer some questions about the DNR.

The Legislature right now has all of the money that we spend on O.R.V. stickers. We need the Legislature to turn the money over to these parks so we can reopen them.

Putt Caverly will be our Representative on the Trails Council.

Covert Property - Vic Molter gave us a report on the Covert Property.

We no longer own 330 ft. south of County Road 376 which includes the access road and part of the Bog hole.

We are held responsible to fill the Bog hole back in. Dick Hubler made a motion to repair the Bog hole in the state it was in before we dug the hole deeper. Bob Lakosky seconded. Motion carried.

We can not use the road in front of the property for parking at S.O.R.

S.O.R. - Ted Hooper reported on the side meeting.

Parking is going to be a problem this year since we can not park on the road in front of the site.

The Fire Department won't be there for the Concession stand this year. Safety factor is the biggest problem.

Bob Lakosky made a motion to move S.O.R. from the Covert Property to the Davison site, and keep it the same date as already planned. Roger Roney seconded. Motion failed. A roll call vote showed 9 clubs wanted it at Davison and 23 clubs wanted it at Covert.

Bob Lakosky is in charge of the work site for S.O.R. The scheduled work weekend at the S.O.R. Site will be June 27 & 28. There will be a party Saturday Night.

Many complaints were brought up to Ted about the prices of S.O.R. Ted has revised the prices as follows:

\$3.00 - Adult - Great Lakes Member - 1 day.  
Children under 12 free.  
\$4.00 - Non-Member - 1 day.  
\$6.00 - Adult - Great Lakes Member - Weekend  
\$8.00 - Adult - Non-Member - Weekend  
\$2.00 - Camping Fee

If you are a competitor you will camp free.

Roger Roney made a motion to accept the following outline on prices for S.O.R. Tom Lewandowski seconded. Motion Carried.

Trophies - The clubs that were at this Quarterly saw the styles of the trophies and Wayne Healey made a motion to let the race chairman pick out the trophies. Dick Hubler seconded. Motion carried.

Tahquamenon Challenge - The Delta Four Wheelers have challenged all clubs and individuals to beat them in the Tahquamenon Challenge. This is a donation of money to the school district in Paradise. They receive no State Aid and they need our help.

A tally will be kept and announced at the Sunday Party at Whitefish.

United - Claude Conn and Putt Caverly both gave us a report on United.

United is having another raffle. They are going to give away a Jeep Scrambler.

United would like club articles on your activities for their United Voice. The deadline for the United Voice is the first of every month.

Harold Brown is working on educational material for United.

Great Lakes received a Certificate of Appreciation for their support to United.

Rules - Jeff Neal reported that there has been a Committee set up with 8 people willing to help with the 81 Rules. With this Committee at least one person out of this Committee will be at races to answer any questions Competitors may have. Have you ever thought how nice it would be if we could all reserve a "Share of Paradise"?

Well! The Whitefish Township School has established a "Certificate of Peace" which will make you an honorary member of Paradise, Michigan. With your donation of any size, we will send you your share.

What is this all about? Where does the money go? The school District of Whitefish is one of the districts in the state that:

1. Does not receive any state aid membership because we do not qualify.
2. Has no industry other than the tourist business.
3. That has a large senior citizen population. (over 50%)
4. That has the fewest options in acquiring grants or other state and federal programs.
5. That does not have a:
  - a. Regular gymnasium, we have instead a room 35 feet x 50 feet that we use for a gym. (Many basketball teams refuse to come here to play because of the size of the floor.)
  - b. Home Economics Program because of no room.
  - c. Industrial Arts Program (No wood shop, auto mechanics, small engine repair, etc.) because there is no room.
  - d. Art because there is no room.
  - e. Music because there is no room.
  - f. Cafeteria because there is no room.
  - g. Counseling because there is no room.
  - h. Resource Center because there is no room.
  - i. Lack of storage, parking facility, no room for helping special needs for children.

One of my biggest challenges this year has been to change the defeated attitude of students, staff and citizens in the community about their school. With that in mind, my major goal has been to get them back on their feet and make them realize that anything is possible if you try, that the people of this beautiful country will help, but only if we try; only if we work hard enough to warrant their trust and their respect.

We are fighting for our right to exist as a school district and to help our kids. My 92 kids have a place in this world as well as a responsibility to it, and we will not give up until the job is done. With this in mind, would you please help us with a donation to our program.

The Board of Education has set a goal of acquiring \$500,000.00 in order to solve these challenges and with your help we will be successful. I am asking for your financial support in order to build rooms that should be basic to every district in the state. WILL YOU HELP!

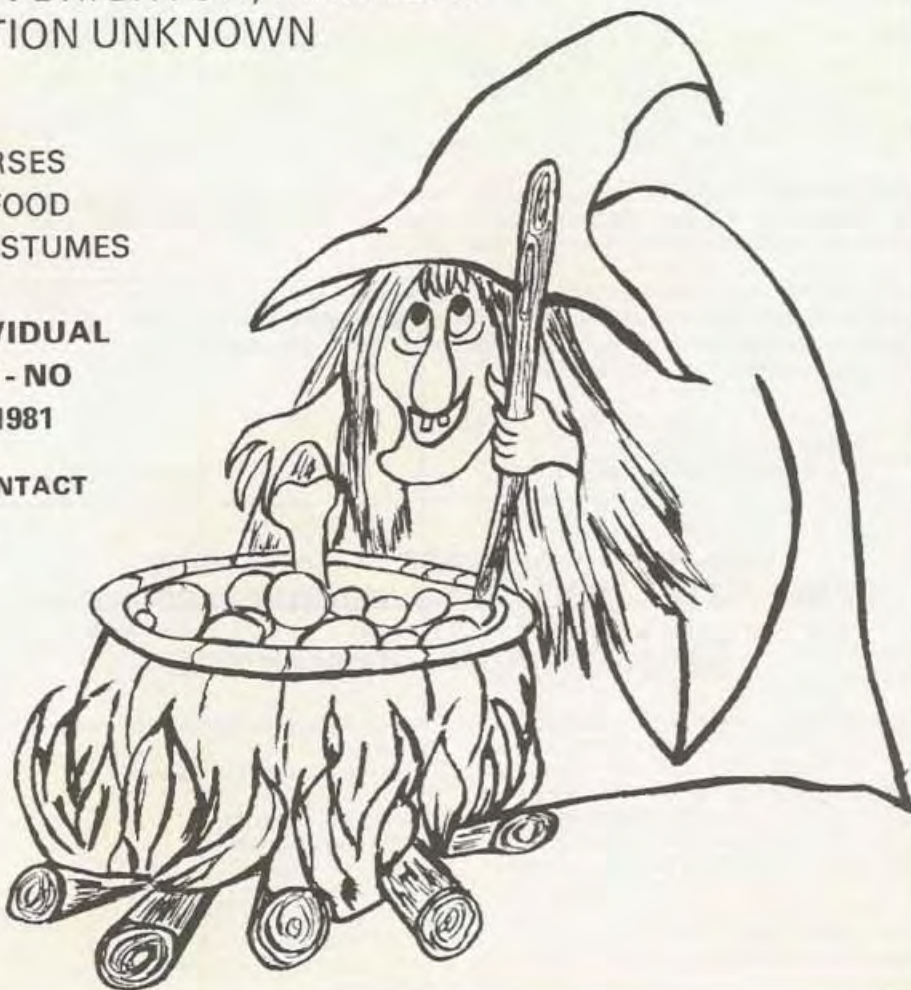

Attached is a map of the potential ORV facilities of Michigan. This map is a result of a cooperative effort between the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and the Michigan Off-Road-Vehicle Action Coalition. It illustrates the goal of Michigan's ORV plan for over 1,500 miles of off-road trail, over 4,000 miles of ORV route and three use areas in southern Michigan.

Each of these facilities is aimed at a user need. Trails at individuals or families using 2 or 3 wheeled ORV's. ORV routes at the "I want to go someplace rider," both motorcycle and 4 wheel ORV users. And use areas at all users, especially in areas where trails are not feasible.

ORV trails are designated ways designed for vehicles less than 40 inches in width (motorcycles, 3-wheelers). Such trails are entirely off of road-license requiring roads. Such licensing is not required for their use, however ORV registration is.

ORV routes are designated secondary roads, forest roads and intermittent forest trails. A typical example is the Michigan Cross Country Cycle Trail. ORV routes will require road-licensing and ORV registration.

Use areas are another planned facility. They will provide a place for cross-country play riding. For example, the St. Helen Motorsport Area. Such areas provide off-road riding at trail heads or in locations where trail development is not possible, such as in southern Michigan.

How soon these goals are reached depends much on the ORV user. This program is funded from ORV registrations. Registrations so far have numbered only some 80,000 per year. This has provided less than \$200,000 per year to the DNR. But if that number increased to \$250,000 registrations per year, this program would be well on its way.

For instance, 250,000 registrations can initially fund 2,100 miles of additional trail per year, or 4,200 miles of route per year or 1 use area in southern Michigan every two years.

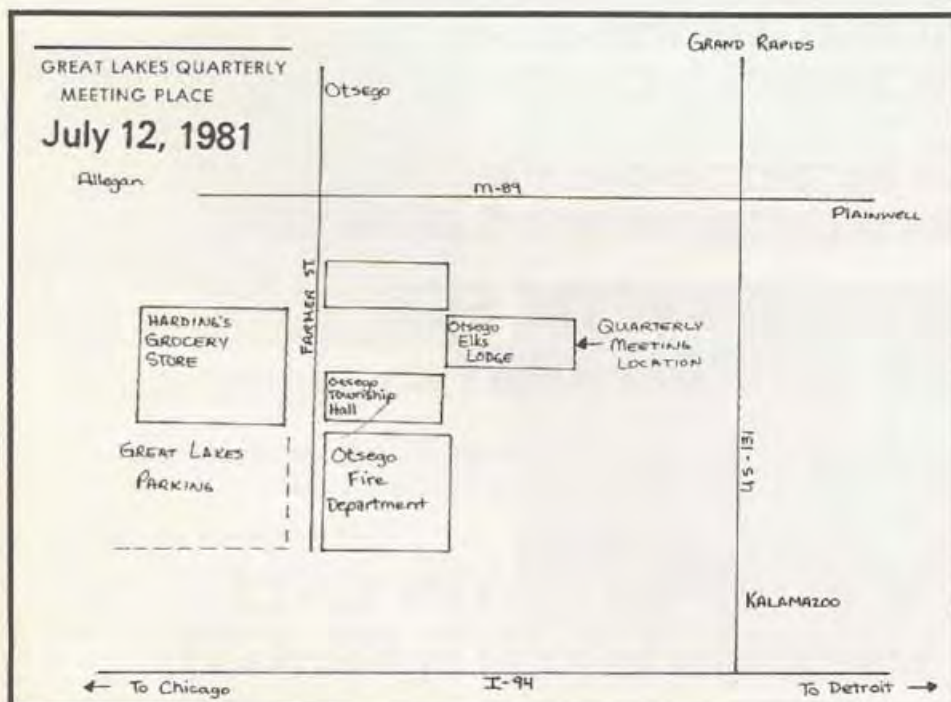

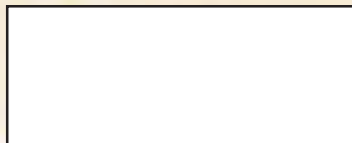
